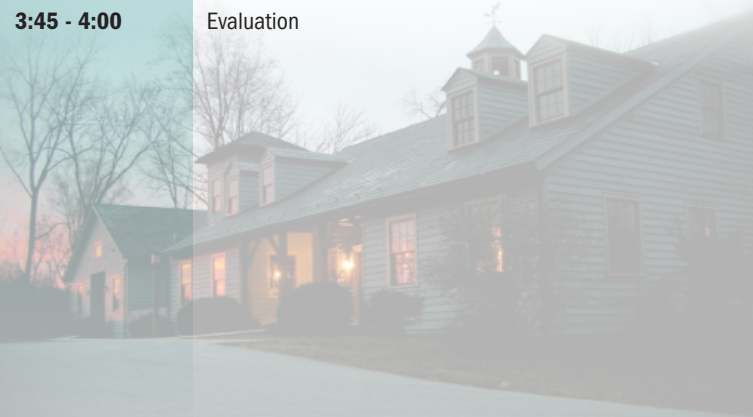

Overview

This event is designed to provide midwives with the most up-to-date information, emphasizing recent developments in midwifery healthcare practice and to provide key solutions to the latest challenges faced by midwives. Objectives

- Review safe feeding alternatives to breast milk
- Discuss history and importance of newborn screening
- Use case studies to identify signs and symptoms of genetic conditions in newborns common to the Plain community for early diagnosis and treatment options
- Identify recommendations for maternal Tdap and review pertussis risks in first year of life
- Recognize a normal vs. abnormal pulse oximetry reading and when to refer to a specialist
- Develop a differential diagnosis for poor feeding and lethargy in newborn
- Discuss genetic screening in Plain populations
