In 1989, Dr. D. Holmes and Mrs. Caroline Morton partnered with local Amish and Mennonite communities to found the Clinic for Special Children (CSC) – a new approach to care for children suffering from rare, genetic disease in Lancaster County. Although CSC was founded to treat metabolic disorders, the organization now treats patients with genetic disorders of all types from many locations and many backgrounds. Since its founding, CSC has endeavored to integrate advanced laboratory techniques into everyday primary care. The CSC is envisioned as a medical home for patients, meaning they can see physicians knowledgeable about their disorder when they are sick and when they are well. Despite the innovative and pioneering nature of CSC, the Clinic remains focused on its most important task: providing care to vulnerable individuals with genetic disease.

Prevention & Access

The Clinic for Special Children (CSC) is a world leader in personalized genomic medicine. Our staff of dedicated individuals treats about 1,100 active patients, diagnoses and manages over 300 genetic disorders, and collaborates with a thriving community of local practitioners, scientists, hospital systems, academic centers, and private industry. Through these partnerships, we have integrated subspecialty medical care, such as cardiology, audiology, and ophthalmology, into our medical service so patients have direct access to advanced clinicians and unparalleled coordinated care. We provide a 24hour call service, where home visits and inpatient hospital care are standard.
