Home, sweet home! On Monday, April 1, 2024, we officially moved into our new, expanded facility in Gordonville, PA. After many years of planning for this next phase, we're excited to welcome families to our new facility. We're grateful to the many donors, businesses, families, and community members who have provided essential support to make this project a reality. While we've been working on our new facility, our everyday work of caring for patients has continued with no delays or interruptions. This wouldn't have been possible without a community of supporters.

Our new facility allows us to keep improving and expanding what we offer to the families we serve. The much-needed additional space and upgrades enable us to work more efficiently and collaboratively. For example, we can now host more clinics with over 18 visiting specialists, which reduces critical barriers to care and will provide new services on-site. Multiple discussion rooms and meeting spaces will give families comfortable spaces to relax when they're here for all-day visits and provide private spaces for in-depth conversations with physicians.

Thoughtfully designed exam rooms provide adequate space for accompanying family members and accessibility devices and will feature more comfortable exam tables. We also have several rooms designed specifically for adults who visit us for their complex care. With a large assembly room, we can again host educational family days at the Clinic instead of renting space.

Our new integrated laboratory provides a more efficient workspace for scientists and researchers, allowing them to increase testing capacity and find answers more quickly. And, to the joy of many children, we now have a fully accessible playground. The entire building has been designed with input from staff, board members, families, and collaborators to make it more comfortable, accessible, and efficient for everyone who visits the Clinic.

We are sincerely grateful to over 2,600 supporters of our capital campaign so far. If you haven't supported the campaign yet, there's still time! We are still actively raising funds to finish the campaign, and you can learn more about how to give on page 4. With your support, vulnerable families will have a place to turn to when they need specialized care for generations to come.


You and your family are invited to join us at a 2024 benefit auction!

Crystal Martin has been coming to the Clinic since she was two days old. That was 26 years ago.

Born with Maple Syrup Urine Disease (MSUD), Crystal benefitted from the Clinic's groundbreaking discoveries into this devastating condition. Previously, one in three people with MSUD died in childhood. The condition left many others with severe neurological and physical disabilities.

Not Crystal.

Clinic physicians immediately started her on a special formula they developed and later transitioned her to a diet that prevented brain damage. Growing up with a severe metabolic disease was not easy, as her condition could change quickly. Yet she has good memories of her frequent visits to the Clinic.

"All three doctors were trying to figure me out, not just one," she recalls. "The doctors would draw things out so I could understand them." She also remembers that after having blood drawn, "I would run my blood samples down the hall to Erik" (Dr. Puffenberger, the Laboratory Director). Stickers, Band-Aids, and Beanie Babies remain part of her Clinic memories.

A liver transplant at age 15 changed her life. The Clinic's close collaborative relationship with UPMC Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh helped make the transplant possible. For Crystal, a properly functioning liver meant

the end of her many dietary restrictions. Her first request? Mint chocolate chip ice cream. "It was creamier than I expected."

Crystal is now a teacher at the Millway School. She returns to the Clinic for quarterly checkups and has monthly blood tests to monitor her condition. "Being able to continue to meet with my doctors at the Clinic's new facility will be a great benefit," she says. "The new location is 15 minutes closer for me, too."



LEADERSHIP TEAM

We're excited to introduce our 2024 leadership team! For 35 years, the Clinic has evolved to meet the changing needs of the communities we serve. In our daily work, we continue to adapt to an ever-increasing demand for our clinical, laboratory, and research services. In recognition of these changing needs and opportunities, we refined certain roles at the Clinic and also created some new ones.

As part of this transition, Dr. Kevin Strauss took on a new role at the Clinic as our *Head of Therapeutic Development*. He will lead collaborative research work to develop life-changing therapies for disorders that commonly afflict people of Plain ancestry.

In recognition of our demand for clinical and research services, several staff members received appointments to the Clinic's leadership team, including Dr. Laura Poskitt as *Medical Director* and Alexis McVey, BSN, RN, CPN as *Nursing Director*. ProVia

At the forefront of ProVia are the company's values: integrity, generosity, and compassion. Founded in 1977 by two brothers in Sugarcreek, OH, ProVia manufactures windows, doors, vinyl siding, and roofing. Today, the company employs over 2,000 employees, has six manufacturing plants, and sells its products across the United States. While ProVia's growth over 45 years has been exponential, it's something else that founder Bill Mullet is most proud of. "We've stayed true to our purpose. Every person and company should know their purpose. It surprises people that our products aren't mentioned in our purpose statement. The most important part of our work is: To let our light shine before others so that they may see our good works and give glory to our Father who is in heaven (adapted from Matthew 5:16)."

Bill first heard about the Clinic for Special Children from the Clinic's board chair, Herman Bontrager. "When Bill and I got to know each other almost 60 years ago doing alternative service in El Salvador, neither of us imagined that our paths would cross at the Clinic for Special Children in this way," shares Herman.

"Herman called me and explained the important work the Clinic does to improve the health of children. He shared about the Clinic's new building project and inquired about windows for the new building," explains Bill. In a sequence of events, Bill shared the word about the Clinic's need with his son Craig, Vice President of Corporate Care at ProVia, and his son-in-law Gene Esh at Premiere Distribution, and the three men worked together to support the Clinic's project with a gift of all new windows for the entire building.

"It was easy for us to identify with the Clinic's need and good cause. It's our goal to contribute where funds or projects are used to serve humanity and the well-being of others who need assistance. It's my obligation as a believer to continue contributing to society with a service or a product, even though I retired from ProVia about ten years ago," explains Bill. 
