S.T.A.B.L.E. is based on a mnemonic to optimize learning and retention. It stands for the six assessment and care modules in the program: **S**ugar, **T**emperature, **A**irway, **B**lood pressure, **L**ab work, and **E**motional support.

Learning Objectives

- Identify the symptoms of failure to adapt to the new environment by utilizing the standard S.T.A.B.L.E. mnemonic.
- Apply interventions to promote safety and clinical care as the newborn transitions to the new environment.
- Demonstrate advance assessment, intervention, and communication skills to monitor and treat the transitioning newborn in a timely manner based on standards of care.
