## Care Closer to Home

### The Yoder Family

**Leah Yoder has known the Clinic for Special Children for most of her life.** As a little girl, she remembers tagging along with her siblings to their appointments at our original Strasburg location. Nearly two decades later, when Leah was expecting her first child, a daughter named Denna, she was grateful to already be familiar with the Clinic.

“My husband and I knew we wanted to have the Plain Insight Panel™ carrier testing done before having Denna,” Leah shares. “We were aware of certain rare genetic disorders on both sides of our families, and we found out we were both carriers for glutaric acidemia type 1 (GA-1). Having that information ahead of time allowed us to be prepared for Denna’s arrival.” GA-1 is a rare metabolic disorder that, without treatment, can cause permanent brain injury from the buildup of specific amino acids that the body can’t process properly.

While Leah was in the hospital awaiting Denna’s birth, the Clinic team brought special formula for babies with GA-1 directly to their hospital room so she could begin a specialized diet immediately in case she had GA-1.

After Denna was born, the Clinic’s on-call laboratory team ran diagnostic testing and confirmed her GA-1 diagnosis on the same day. A few days later, Leah and her husband, Ben, brought Denna to the Clinic in Gordonville for her first visit. There, our doctors carefully explained how to care for Denna and manage her specialized diet.

Although much has changed at the Clinic

since Leah’s childhood visits, some things have remained the same. “One thing that was very helpful was already knowing people at the Clinic before I personally needed your services for my daughter,” Leah says. “I’ve known Christine, a Clinic nurse and Outreach Program Manager, for as long as I can remember. Our families have visited each other, and she’s always stayed in touch, even sending Christmas cards. It was reassuring to know she was helping care for Denna.”

In addition to providing deeply personal care, the Clinic has also made care more accessible for Leah’s family. In 2019, we established an outreach clinic in Mifflinburg, where our team sees patients for non-urgent visits closer to home. One day a month, clinicians, including Drs. Vincent Carson and Julia Goroff, travel to Mifflinburg to care for families.

“It’s been incredibly helpful to have Denna seen in Mifflinburg,” Leah explains. “It’s about half the drive compared to Lancaster, and since we have to pay for a driver, it saves us a lot in transportation costs. The team can even take blood samples there and will call us with any necessary diet changes, then mail us a copy. Dr. Julia Goroff has been especially helpful in managing Denna’s care through the outreach clinic.”

Today, Denna is almost two years old. She is a happy little girl who loves animals, enjoys playing with her toys, and delights in spending time with horses and puppies. She has met all of her developmental milestones and often greets our team with bright smiles during her visits.

## Plain Insight Panel™

### Pricing Update

To continue delivering high-quality testing amid rising costs and increased sample volume, we will be **adjusting pricing for our Plain Insight Panel (PIP) test effective April 20, 2026.**

**Starting 4/20, the cost of a PIP test is \$350.** For couples who submit their samples together, they will receive a **discounted couples bundle price of \$650 total.**

The PIP was originally priced well below cost to encourage participation and demonstrate its value. The steady growth of the demand for the PIP has made subsidizing the test at the current level increasingly unsustainable.

Even with generous charitable support, a large proportion of the cost, roughly \$660,000 in fiscal year 2025, continues to be subsidized directly from the Clinic for Special Children's operating budget.

At this new price, the PIP remains below cost, with directed donations and Clinic operational funds covering the difference.

This change ensures the PIP remains fully available, reliable, and sustainable, so families and clinicians can continue to depend on the crucial insights it provides.

There continue to be regional measles outbreaks across the country, including recent cases in Lancaster County. So far, all the cases in Lancaster have been among people who were unvaccinated. Due to this, we encourage measles vaccination (MMR vaccine) amid the current outbreak.

In addition to the MMR vaccine, we regularly offer vaccine clinics for anyone uninsured (you don't have to be a Clinic pa-

tient). The cost is \$20 per person, and the fee covers all vaccines needed in one visit. To schedule, call us at 717-687-9407.

If you have an upcoming appointment at the Clinic and you or a family member is experiencing fever, red eyes, cough, and a full-body rash that starts on the head, please call our office at 717-687-9407 before coming in for your appointment, because the measles virus is highly contagious.

Focused on care, research, & knowledge

Since our founding in 1989, we have worked to provide compassionate, expert care for individuals with complex medical needs. Guided by our mission, we've combined clinical care, research, and laboratory innovation to make a lasting difference in the lives of many families.

Throughout 2025, we worked on developing a new strategic plan, building on our foundation with plans by 2029 to expand our services, identify more strategies and treatments that improve quality of life, and share our knowledge as we continue to learn.

Learn more about the elements of our plan below and the three key strategic areas that frame our plan: expanding accessible care, engaging in impactful research, and sharing knowledge.

### Expanding Accessible Care

Expanding service offerings at the Clinic's office or other relevant geographic areas.

**Collaborate with a maternal-fetal medicine specialist** to provide regular specialty services on-site at the Clinic.

**Coordinate the creation of an independent pharmaceutical development company** to support the creation of new gene therapies for ultra-rare conditions, like Maple Syrup Urine Disease.

**Conduct outreach clinics in geographic areas that are in need of our services**, and determine frequency and/or presence requirements by the clinical needs of the community.

**Develop robust protocols and pathways for referrals to specialty services** that are not available at the Clinic.

### Engaging in Impactful Research

Improving quality of life through new strategies and therapies.

**Standardize the collection of clinical data** to enable future studies on the natural histories of disorders and **identify funding opportunities** for innovative research studies.

**Expand our knowledge of how potentially harmful genetic variants impact health** through collaborations and clinical investigation.

**Participate and conduct clinical trials for new pharmaceuticals, including prenatal therapies**, to further rare disease drug development and provide access to treatments.

**Expand our in-house lab testing capabilities by developing a non-invasive prenatal test (NIPT).**

### Sharing Knowledge

Disseminating knowledge within the organization and to others.

**Develop a curriculum for external providers** to leverage our expertise, strengthen our community engagement, and enhance clinical care.

Ensure seamless continuity, share knowledge, and redundancy through **succession planning for key positions.**

**Implement a robust onboarding program** for new staff to equip them with the knowledge and skills needed for success.

## Missouri Outreach Clinic | Local Access to Expert Care

A collaboration with the Scotland County Hospital in Memphis, MO

**In 37 years, the Clinic has served families from 17 countries and 46 states, including Missouri!** As the Missouri and surrounding Plain communities (Amish and Mennonite) continue to grow, we have seen a steady increase in patients residing in the region.

For years, the generous community near Memphis, MO, has hosted annual benefit auctions to support both the Clinic and a local nonprofit, Helping Hands. To bring our compassionate care closer to home, we officially added Missouri as an outreach location in 2025. We were fortunate to have the local community connect us with Scotland County Hospital in Memphis to help us offer this outreach clinic.

Scotland County Hospital is a critical access hospital in rural northeast Missouri serving four surrounding counties. They offer a comprehensive range of services, including family practice, labor and delivery, surgery, and infusion therapy.

Meagan Weber, DPT, MBA, Chief Executive Officer of Scotland County Hospital (pictured on far right above), recalls how the partnership began: “We care for many shared patients within our family practice and therapy departments. Our team first connected us with Dr. Vincent Carson when he visited the 2022 Missouri Benefit Auction in Scotland County. Today, our physicians frequently collaborate with Dr. Carson to provide seamless care for our mutual patients.”

At our first Missouri outreach clinic last August, the Scotland County Hospital team went beyond simply leasing space; they provided essential staffing support to assist Dr. Carson. These team members helped welcome families, coordinate rooming, and record vital signs, ensuring a smooth experience for every patient.

One of these team members, Rosy Zimmerman (pictured on far left above), has a deeply personal connection to the Clinic. Her late daughter, Everlee, was diagnosed with a rare genetic disorder called

*POMT1*. While Everlee was not a patient of the Clinic, her care team at St. Louis Children’s Hospital collaborated with our specialists on her care. Everlee’s journey even helped our laboratory team add *POMT1* to our Plain Insight Panel™ test.


“The drive I have behind being so passionate about the Clinic is to help keep Everlee’s memory alive,” Rosy explains. “I’ve chosen to honor Everlee by helping other families going through similar situations. I’m trying my best not to just let this experience happen to me, but to use it for good to help others.”

As a medical professional, Rosy knows how vital local access is. “I’m so excited that this community is getting access to specialized

care for rare genetic disorders. Many families are so thankful they don’t have to travel all the way to Pennsylvania. The community here is growing rapidly, and I believe that need will only increase.”

Dr. Weber echoes this sentiment: “Our mission at Scotland County Hospital is to serve our community. Hosting a local outreach clinic is deeply meaningful for families in northeast Missouri and southeast Iowa. For these patients, it’s the one time a year they can receive specialized care without the long journey to Pennsylvania.”

We are profoundly grateful to Scotland County Hospital and Rosy Zimmerman for their dedication to the Clinic and for helping ensure that families in Missouri and surrounding areas receive the specialized care they need for rare genetic disorders.

## Expanding Our Outreach by Dr. Laura Poskitt, Medical Director

Our outreach program continues to expand because families need care that meets them where they are.

The Clinic's formal outreach program began in 2003, after recognizing a growing number of patients in the Somerset, PA, area who would benefit from seeing our team closer to home. Our commitment to reducing barriers to care remains central to our mission today. In fact, expanding access to care is a key priority in our 2026–2029 Strategic Plan (outlined on page 4).

With this goal in mind, we added several new outreach clinic sites last year, including locations in Newville, PA; Penn Yan, NY; and Memphis, MO. The response was immediate. Each of these sites quickly filled, underscoring the strong and growing demand for specialized care closer to home.

The impact of outreach clinics can save time, reduce stress, and make healthcare simpler. One of the families who visits our Mifflinburg outreach clinics says, "Coming to the outreach clinic doesn't take nearly as long. It saves up to about a two-hour drive each way for us. We also appreciate the different specialists who visit the Clinic in Gordonville. We would otherwise have to go to Delaware, but it's much easier and closer to see specialists at the Clinic."

As the outreach program has grown, so has the need for thoughtful coordination behind the scenes. Last year, Christine Hendrickson, RN, BSN, PED-BC, a longtime nurse at the Clinic, stepped into the newly created role of Outreach Program Manager. She oversees the logistics of each outreach clinic, helping ensure that families receive high-quality care no matter where they are seen.

We anticipate continued growth in outreach demand and will regularly evaluate clinic frequency and locations as part of our long-term strategic planning. While the importance of this program is clear from an operational standpoint, it is the families that best illustrate its true impact – bringing expert care closer to home, when and where it's needed most.


